Dedicated to consistent outcome measurement and reporting, results are very strong.

SFI uses proprietary technology—the Intelligent Research Intervention Software (IRIS) platform (Co-founded and lead by Dr. Lingley-Pottie)—and highly trained and monitored paraprofessional coaches to deliver its programs from a call-centre in Nova Scotia, to families in the comfort and privacy of their own homes. Dr. Pottie's research has shown that coaches and clients develop a strong therapeutic bond from a distance and that the telephone provides anonymity that makes it easier for participants to open up than in face-to-face settings.

"It is my life's passion and career vision to improve the lives of children and families. Without the strong support and mentorship of a number of people, I would not of course be in this position. This nomination is such an honour as it places me in a group of outstanding women entrepreneurs in Canada. It is with all of those whom are in my corner I celebrate with today."
